1	Henri Louis Levasseur, a bronze Le beau Paon. 'The Beautiful Peacock', emblematic of vanity, the scantily clad maiden holds a mirror up to the bird, perched on a pillar, signed to the base of the pillar, on a rouge marble base, height 56cm.
2	A circular wax relief portrait of the Virgin Mary. 19th century, with a painted gilt border, by repute from Beziers Cathedral, diameter 16.5cm, together with a gilt metal mounted crucifix (2).
3	Two 19th century Dutch fruitwood peat buckets. One with a brass liner, both with a brass swing handle, with vertical staved bands, height 33cm (2).
4	A Royal Academy of Music bronze medal awarded to May John, 1896. Mary Hannah John (May), awarded for singing, she was a Welsh singer and revivalist (1874-1962).
5	A Swiss rosewood, inlaid, and ebonised cylinder music box. Late 19th century, the 41cm cylinder playing 12 airs and striking on six engraved brass bells, the tune sheet with ink inscriptions, and printed 'Etouffoirs en acier soit a spiraux', numbered 1539, repeated to the winding handle, the lid an[more]
6	A pair of French spelter figures of agricultural workers. Late 19th century, with painted decoration, height 40cm (2).
7	A resin Pikolinos advertising figure of a cobbler. On a square base, height 73cm, together with a cast metal figure of a terrier (2).
8	A set of Victorian brass banker's scales. By Williams & Sons, London, with twin pans, height 54cm together with a set of German brass letter scales (2).
9	An American Civil War themed chess set. With hand painted pewter figures, the kings modelled as Abraham Lincoln and Jefferson Davis. The pieces cased in a lined, fitted box with chess board top. The box height 5.5cm, width 32cm, depth 32cm.
10	Peter HONE (b.1941) A plaster bust of Marguerite Gardiner, Countess of Blessington, after Alfred Guillaume Gabriel Grimod D'Orsay, Compte D'Orsay. Height 25.5cm.Provenance: Peter Hone: The London Collection 14th March 2024.
11	An Amplion 'Dragon' horn speaker. Bentwood and metal, serial number C99672, height 51cm, diameter of horn 38cm.
12	After Pierre Jules Mene, a bronze figure of a fox. Lying, on an oval base, with raised head, width 13cm.
13	A Dutch mahogany and inlaid tea stew or stove. 19th century, with a brass insert and waisted banded body, height 41cm, together with a similar later oak tea stew with spindle turned sides and with a brass kettle, and another similar (3).
14	A Brass and mahogany sea fishing reel. With composition winding handles, diameter 14.5cm.

15	A lighthouse light bulb. Height 40cm, another slightly earlier bulb, and one other, contained in a Trinity House box, together with a shield (5)
16	A Burmese bronze sculpture of a horse and rider. Height 35cm. Together with an Indian bronze horse on wheels, height 17.5cm.
17	A pair of bronze figures, emblematic of Summer and Autumn. Early-mid 19th century, probably French, raised on square Siena marble bases, height 22cm (2).
18	An Admiralty pattern black bakelite and chrome telephone. 1950s, GEC, stamped A.P.2932, together with a GPO PX57 Bakelite telephone, with a lower drawer (2).
19	After Antoine Louis Barye, a bronze figure of a horse. A reduced version of Cheval Turc, with left foreleg raised, signed in the cast on the rectangular base, height 13cm, width 12.5cm.
20	A small crocodile attache or briefcase. Circa 1930, with letter and stationery compartment to the lid, height 10cm, width 38cm, depth 26cm.
21	An Austrian cold painted bronze trinket dish as a pug with a basket. Height 8cm, together with two carved mother-of-pearl small plaques, a collection of gold plated cufflinks, and a gilt metal pin cushion, modelled as a pheasant.
22	Four brass model desk cannons. Each 24cm in length.
23	A French 'rat de cave' wrought iron candlestick. 20th century, height 19cm, together with another similar, a pair of 19th century steel sugar crushers, and a wheelwright's steel traveler, stamped Balmforth Bros 1915 (4).
24	Two similar brass pricket altar candlesticks. 20th century, with knopped leafy cast stem, on paw feet, height 66cm (2).
25	Five handpainted fairground style panels. Depicting flowers, leaves and abstract patterns, each painted onto plywood, measuring 48cm x 57cm and smaller (5).
26	A late 19th century French child-sized mannequin. Pressed cardboard with 'leather' finish and black painted wooden boots. Height 102cm.
27	Simeon STAFFORD (b. 1956) 'Bumping Cars' Oil on boardSigned 104.5cm x 113cm
28	Mother of pearl opera glasses. Seven pairs some in cases, including one pair by La Fontaine Opticians 18 Palais Royal in a velvet case and one pair by Negretti and Zamba (7).
29	An African tribal phallus fertility stick. Carved hardwood, length 61cm.
30	A pair of Art Deco Bakelite twin branch candelabra. Height 9cm, width 13cm. Together with a set of four Art Deco style bottle stoppers with display stand.
31	A carved marble stepped plinth base. Height 10cm, width 30cm, depth 20.5cm.Provenance: The personal collection of Peter Hone.
32	A chrome plated brass car mascot of a horse and jockey. In a galloping pose, the jockey with enamelled silks, height 11cm, width 15cm, together with another mascot, the jockey in similar enamelled silks, both stamped LL Mascots, made in England, Benson & Hedges Book of Racing Colours, limited ed[more]

33	A wrought iron utensil or game hanger. With cockerel mounts, length 58cm, together with a wrought iron hanging candle lamp holder and shade, and two Byzantine cast metal hanging candle holders (4).
34	Two handpainted circus-style signs. 'Freak Show' and 'Circus' painted in bright yellow and red, each painted onto plywood, Freak Show 82cm x 19cm and Circus 60cm x 19cm.
35	An Artist's adjustable stained beech folding easel. Early 20th century, height 183cm.
36	A Rowntree's pastilles enamel sign. 15X40cm.
37	A carved pine rococo corbel or mount. 19th century, carved with leafy scrolls, height 36cm.

50	A British military Perry Barr Hand-Crank Fire Bell. 29cm in diameter, with broad arrow mark.
51	An HMS Foudroyant Nelson commemorative copper and oak walking cane. Sold in aid of the British Sailors' Society with the materials recovered when the vessel was broken up, length 89cm, together with a violin bow (2).

52	A Charles Eustace, Hayle Arts and Crafts copper tray. Engraved with a tin mine and engine houses, unsigned, width 49cm.
53	A Mali Bozo fish puppet. Carved hardwood with a painted finish, length 39cm.
54	A set of Victorian Degrave, Short & Fanner postal scales. Brass, with a mahogany base, height 26cm, together with a larger brass and mahogany balance, height 55cm, and some weights.
55	An Art Deco gilt finish bronze mounted table lamp. Modelled as a female nude reclining beside a jewellery casket, on an alabaster base, the lamp with a replacement cylindrical shade, height 24cm
56	Four field artillery model desk cannons. Brass and cast iron, the cast iron pair are marked GR, each 20cm long.
57	A Charles Horner 'Little Dorcas' steel cored thimble, size 5. Together with three 'Doris' thimbles, sizes 9, 12 & 14, and a brass mesh and enamel thimble modelled as a bird's head (5).
58	A copper tea urn. With silver plated ram's mask handles. Overall height 58cm.
59	Three handpainted fairground style signs. Two triangular payment signs, 50p and £1, with a 'Ladies! Nickers must be worn on this ride' (sic) sign, all painted onto plywood (3).
60	A quantity of leather binocular cases. Various makers including J.H Steward, F.Ltd, Crown Optical Co, Baltic Goods Co, all empty, some are initialled (20).
61	Folding binoculars and opera glasses. Including a Negretti & Zambri green bakelite pair of opera glasses in a faux leather case, a pair of Bausch 'Winett' binoculars, a pair of Kershaw elite binoculars, a pair of Mars folding opera glasses and others (10).
62	A Victorian copper candle lantern. With overhead handle, three glazed panes with wire grilles, and opening rear door, height 44cm.
63	A carved hardwood Ashanti stool. Ghana, late 19th/ early 20th century, with a swept seat on a pierced central support, height 28cm, width 48cm, depth 25cm.
63A	A cased carved wood model of a pike. Handpainted with glass eyes, cased in a naturalistic setting with real tree trunks and stones, height 38cm, width 98cm, depth 29cm.
64	A 3" astronomical telescope. Raised on a brass column and folding tripod base.
65	A hand painted sign, inscribed 'Goodwood Revival'. Decorated with a figure driving a red racing car. 61cm x 122cm
66	A brass jardiniere on stand, circa 1900. The jardiniere repousse decorated with fruiting vines, and with twin lion mask handles. The stand decorated with a pair of wyverns .Overall height 103cm.
67	A carved wood Egyptian-style cat. Height 94cm, with another painted wood cat figure and a brass Scottie dog fire companion set without the tools (3).
68	A matched set of ten silver handled dinner knives Some with blades engraved Mount Stephen, Cutler Torquay, and Plymouth, similar dessert knives, and a fork, contained in a mahogany box, together with a silver mounted walking stick, and sundry platedware, etc.

69	embossed red cloth, browning and some tears. A short lived newspaper published by the Government during the General Strike of 1926.
70	A Dutch walnut and fruitwood peat bucket. 19th century, with a brass liner and handle and of vertical staved construction height 35cm.
71	A Victorian shaped marble mortar. Height 15cm, diameter 32cm, together with a pestle.
72	A carved hardwood fertility staff. Republic of Congo, early-mid 20th century, length 24cm.
73	A 20th century painted plaster wall mask. Inscribed 'Laughing Face F. Hill 19' on remnants of paper label to verso, height 21.5cm, together with a papier mache copy of the same mask (2).
74	Bentley Motors. A silver plated keyring, boxed, two Wedgwood Mk VI & Silver Wraith Diamond Jubilee 2006 pin trays, and a small wooden jigsaw puzzle (4).
75	Vincenzo Gemito, A Neapolitan bronze figure. Fisher boy, late 19th century, the crouching figure glances at his catch on a rocky base, signed in the cast and with an indistinct foundry mark, height 37cm.
76	A 19th century, gold topped, malacca walking cane. The finial with foliate scroll embossed decoration, length 91cm.
77	A set of three Farrow and Jackson bronze measures. Quart, pint, and half pint, stamped marks, the largest height 16cm.
78	Two tribal fetish figures. Carved wood and fabric wrapped in twine, one with blue paint residue, height 37cm and smaller.
79	A set of brass banker's scales by Doyle & Son, Borough, London. With two pans and a set of coin weights, together with a set of postal scales and weights, by Mordan & Co (2).
80	Two Joseph Sankey and Sons graduated copper jugs. With Art Nouveau repousse decoration, 20cm and smaller, with other copper and brassware (13).
81	A Satinwood and purple heart banded work box. Palais Royal, with cut steel decoration, a mother of pearl plaque to the top reads 'M.M. Presented by Mrs Gubbs', silk lined interior, pull out top compartment with mother of pearl fittings and four mother of pearl and bone spools, box height 12cm, width[more]
82	A Fijian bark cloth. With geometric designs, 184 x 123cm.
83	A Newlyn copper pen tray. Repousse decorated with three fish on a hammered ground, stamped mark, 7X26cm.
84	An ornate Eastern hardwood triple frame. With carved decoration, 20X38cm, together with a Dutch painted model of a child's high chair, height 47cm (2).
85	A Tramp Art oak box. The top with a central lozenge, with brass handles, height 19cm, width 38cm, depth 21cm, together with a Tramp Art sewing box (2).
86	A stalagmite from Kingston 0n Soar Gypsum mine. Contained in an oak framed and glazed case with an applied copper plaque, height 38cm, 20.5cm square.

94	A Cornish serpentine clock case. With a polished and rough hewn finish, with a Smiths Sectric movement, together with two turned vases, and a candle holder (4).
95	Two 18th century French wrought iron sawtooth pot or trammel hooks. One with fleur de lys ornamentation, the other with diamond shaped decoration. 116cm and 106cm respectively (unextended).
96	An Austin Sculpture composition bust of a classical male. 'Head of Athlete', after the original in the National Museum of Athens. Height 44.5cm.
97	Flambards, two display figures. Mother and child figures floor standing figures both in period style costume, the lady with her shopping bag .mask and ration book, the girl with herb toy Sunny Jim and push chair, these figures include their stands and the rubber Lyles Golden Syrup advertising mat th[more]
98	A Cameroonian Punu Tribe Mask Wooden, used during wedding ceremonies, 51cm x 22cm x 14cm.
99	A quantity of opera and field glasses. Some in cases, made from various material including snakeskin, leather, brass, and celluloid, maker's include Negretti and Zamba, Chevalier Opticians Paris, Kershaw, and C.P. Goerz (27).
100	An Eno's 'Fruit Salt' advertising chromolithograph. Early 20th century, after Rubens Putti with fruit garlands, 37X49cm, in a modern frame, 46X58cm.
101	A late 19th/early 20th century cast iron three tier fan design plant stand. With later green paint. Height 76cm.
102	Two 19th century glass cider sampling taps. Length 45cm.
103	A brass hanging monastery bell. 20th century, cast with a Latin inscription, with chain, height of bell and mount 38cm.

105	An 18th-century, high-purity gold mounted malacca walking cane. The finial chased and repousse decorated with four lobed panels of birds, a squirral and boar, upon a foliate, diaper and scroll ground and ornament motifs, bird or trident stamped mark, length 93cm.Crude repair to the gold finial
106	A hand painted sign. 'Burlesque'. 19cm x 106cm.
107	A Roberts Bestone leather and aluminium portable gramophone. 1920's, the cover incorporating the speaker, fitted a Maxwell soundbox, height 33cm, width 34cm, depth 22cm.
108	A collection of four telephones. Including a Bell Telephone Belgique, a black 1970s example, a 1970s cream wall telephone and a clear perspex Mybelle Spotlight 753 (4).
109	Walker, a bronze figure of a beggar. 20th century, stamped Walker and numbered 5/80, on a polished marble base, height 47cm.
110	A carved and painted wood figure of a Dominican monk. Spanish Colonial, 18th century, possibly St Vincent Ferrer, carved holding a book, on a mound base, height 34.5cm.
111	A cast and painted aluminium bull sculpture. Late 20th century, 21cm tall, 30cm wide x 15cm deep, together with a stylised porcelain figure of a bull, probably Australian by Ellis Pottery (2).
112	A pair of grand tour gilt bronze and silvered urns or vases. 19th century, with double serpent handles, cast in deep relief with Bacchanalian centaurs after the Pompeii Roman Kantharos cup, square slate bases, height 17.5cm, diameter 16cm (2).
113	A decoy style carved and painted wood swan. Height 29.5cm.
114	A terracotta bread crock. With a green painted pine lid and glazed interior, height 30cm, diameter 40cm.
115	Two carved hardwood African masks. With a hand carved wooden polychrome statue of a male and female, with hammered metal cheeks, height 40cm.
116	Michael Simpson, A small bronze figure of a running hare. Signed with initials and numbered 54/250, length 10.5cm, together with a bronzed small figure of Jesus, height 14cm (2). The base of the hare is distorted/slightly bent.
117	Four tooth keys. 19th century, two with turned wooden handles, and one with a spare hook, length 14.5cm and smaller.
118	A decorative Dutch brass mounted copper log bin. 19th century, with lion mask handles and triple paw feet, height 39cm, diameter 44cm, together with two Victorian copper coal helmets, each with swing handles, and a pierced brass coal or log bin (4).
119	A bronze plaque cast 'Trewhella Bros St Erth'. Length 42cm, together with three metal name plates (4).
120	A brass twin branch adjustable oil lamp. Circa 1900, with two burners, the adjustment knob stamped the royal crest, on a weighted circular base, height 64cm.
121	A fossilised Mammoth tooth. Height 25cm, on a painted wood display base.
122	A pair of late 19th/early 20th century spelter figures of soldiers. Each holding a standard, mounted on marble plinths. Both approximately 60cm overall.

123	A pair of Grand Tour bronze figures. Italian, 19th century, modelled as Pan playing the pipes, and a Bacchante dancing with an infant on its shoulders, on Sienna marble bases, height 16cm (2).Pan lacks one pipe, the other with a cracked base.
124	An ornate Tramp Art work or sewing box. Fitted with mirror panels, the overhead handle with heart-shaped terminals, on splay bracket feet, height 29.5cm, width 28cm, depth 17cm.
125	An Egyptian turquoise glazed faience amulet of Isis. Late period, height 4cm.
126	A painted Russian icon. The Virgin of Kazan, inscription at the top left, on a wood panel 18 x 12.5 cm.
127	A carved wood tribal figure. With an animal skull head and cowrie shell eyes, height 50cm.
128	An African carved wood tribal figure. Raised on later stepped rectangular base. Height 76.5cm.
129	A large Tongan Tapa bark cloth. The cream field divided into panels, with earth pigment with emblems, and script, 243X194cm (approx).
130	A painted cast iron trinket box modelled as a crab. Height 8cm, width 32cm, depth 21cm.
131	A Bronze bust of an infant. Possibly Italian 18th or early 19th century, height 12.5cm.
132	A cast resin bust attributed to M Shoebridge. 1950s, with a polished bronze effect finish, on a white painted base, height 30cm.
133	A Horne & Thornthwaite three draw brass telescope. Circa 1850, with a mahogany covered outer tube, total length 58.5cm.
134	A Laurent Giles Jolly Boat 15ft marine ply-built gaff sloop trailer-sailor day boat. Built in 1996, with a Yamaha 4 hp 4-stroke outboard, with road trailer, mast, and traditional tan sail. Length O.D. 15'/4.6m, Beam 6'6"/2.0m, Draft 1'3"/38cm, Displacement 380kg, dry stored.
134A	Drascombe Dabber Sailing Boat. The fiberglass split-rig Dabber offers 118 sq.ft. of sail in the traditional yawl rig of the Drascombe range, offering flexibility of sail plan. Should the wind drop, a small outboard is quite adequate to propel her briskly along, or she can easily be rowed from two[more]
135	HMS Liverpool mahogany and brass ship's wheel. The central boss stamped C11 BSS 1024, diameter 123cm.Removed from the Townclass light cruiser when scrapped in 1958, and placed in the reception of The Ship Ashore guest house in Swanage, Dorset.
136	Multiple sets of vintage weights. Thirty plus weights across four boxes ranging from 7lbs to 100g, mostly bell weights with an open grip, various makers including W&T Avery Ltd, AK & Sons and Bartlett Bristol.
137	A French bronze Art Nouveau portrait plaque. Depicting Marianne in relief with flowing locks, wearing a Phrygian cap and a laurel wreath crown, 16.5cm x 23cm.
138	Two Italian repousse wall plaques. 17th century, one made of spelter, circular in shape, depicting five cherubs, diameter 23cm, the other gilt tin of rectangular form, depicting figures in a wood, signed AHDR (2).
139	Mineral. Stibnite, Kazakhstan, 15cm x 4cm.

152	A collection of wood and brass spirit levels. Various makers, including F.R. Low PTY LTD Sydney and Wilson Lovatt and Sons, Wolverhampton (11).
153	Minerals Stibnite, Romania, 11cm x 6cm.
154	Philip Frederick Alexander, An Arts and Crafts brass plaque. Repousse decorated with a central stylised flowerhead, stamped mark, diameter 27cm.
155	A pair of French military bronze wall plaques. Early to mid 19th century, featuring armour, weapons, rams heads, dogs, lions and wreaths, each 14cm x 19cm.
156	The Champion Cue - R Stevens & Sons, London Snooker Cue One piece, with protective metal case. Cue 147cm.
